October 25 is the Organizational Meeting followed by Regular Meeting.

WHAT'S HAPPENING ON THE OLD ELEVATOR LAND?

- Did you know, the area South of the Village Office is privately owned by TrailNet, not the Village of Acme?
- TrailNet Lands are designated for green space and walking paths.
- The soil that was spread on TrailNet Land is part of an agreement with Trailnet and the Village of Acme.
- The soil is to prepare the area for a green space park (A green space park falls within the allowed uses of TrailNet Land).
- This area will have grass and trees planted in it in 2022.
- The green space will have benches, picnic tables, and potentially a walking path in it and a community gazebo.



TIPPS Program: Tax Installment Payment Plan

The purpose of the TIPPS program is to allow residents to pay their taxes in equal monthly installments (from January – December) without any penalties, instead of a lump sum payment in July of every year.

Eligibility:

- 1. Residents must have a property tax balance of zero (\$0) to start TIPPS.
- 2. Residents must complete the Pre-Authorized Tax Payment Agreement prior to starting TIPPS.

TIPPS payments are automatically withdrawn from the resident's bank accounts under the following conditions.

- ⇒ Payments are made on either the 1st or the 15th of the month.
- ⇒ Payments will only be withdrawn from one bank account per residence.
- \Rightarrow All eligibility requirements for the TIPPS program are met.

WHAT IDENTIFICATION DO YOU NEED TO BRING TO VOTE?

- **OPTION 1:** Valid Photo ID showing photo, name, and current street address. (License, other card issued by a Canadian Government)
- **OPTION 2:** Show two pieces of ID. Both must have your name and at least one must have your current street address. (Bank statement, Utility bill, etc. complete list on elections.ca)
- **OPTION 3:** You can still vote if you declare your identity and address in writing and have someone who knows you and who is assigned to your polling station to vouch for you. The voucher must be able to proved their identity and address.

Vehicle Theft and Property Break-in Prevention Tips from the RCMP

Vehicle theft and car prowling prevention tips:

- Report any suspicious activity or behaviour to the RCMP, such as someone trying door handles on parked vehicles.
- Garage openers should not be left in vehicles or should be disengaged, as thieves can use them to gain entry into a home.
- Avoid parking in unlit areas at night.
- Lock your doors and close all windows at all times, even while you are in your yard.
- Hide your valuables out of sight, or better yet, take them with you.
- Don't keep extra keys in your vehicle.

Home and garage break-in prevention tips:

- Report any suspicious vehicles, activity or behaviour to the RCMP, such as someone showing up at your home "mistakenly" looking for a different address, or going through yards of neighbours who you believe are away.
- Remind your family to close the garage door(s) after removing bikes, vehicles and other items. Any open door is an invitation.
- Despite the warm weather, it is important to ensure windows and doors are secured at all times, even when you're home. Culprits need mere moments to commit a theft.
- If you are away, ensure a friend or neighbour picks up your mail and flyers and keeps your yard appearing cared for, giving the impression that you're around.
- Use timers to control lighting within the home.
- Install exterior motion lights to brighten dark areas around doors or windows to make them easily seen by a neighbour or passersby.
- Lock all garage doors, including the one between an attached garage and the house.
- Always close and lock any windows that could be used to gain access to your home while you're away or sleeping, even on hot summer nights.
- Store important or irreplaceable documents and items away from your home, such as in a safety deposit box. If you see homes with open doors, front doors with keys left in the locks, or a neighbour's car with the trunk left open, give them a quick call to let them know.
- Consider installing home and vehicle alarm systems and vehicle anti-theft devices.

Have you considered joining the Acme Volunteer Fire Department? The Acme Volunteer Fire Department is in need of volunteers, both men and women!

Volunteer Commitment

Practices are held the first four Mondays of every month from 7:00 pm - 9:00 pm. Please feel free to show up and check it out to get a feel as to if this is something you might enjoy. If you have any questions about volunteering you can contact Fire Chief Brian Fradgley or John Tersteeg at acmefirerescue@gmail.com. Applications are available at the Village Office.

You do not need any experience as training is provided at no cost to you. Some examples include: Health Care Provider First Aid/CPR, AED, Q (Air Brake) Endorsement, Fire Fighter Training (vehicle extraction, structure fires, fire engine (pump) operation and traffic control).

We are especially in need of members (male or female) that would be available to respond to daytime calls as many of our present members commute to work during the weekdays. Emergencies that our members attend to include: structure fires, grass/bale fires, vehicle fires, Motor Vehicle Collisions, Medical First Response, downed power lines, gas leaks, and fire alarms.

If you feel as though you would be comfortable attending only medical first responses or only fire calls that is okay. Members are provided with a radio that they carry with them at times when they are available to respond. Red Deer dispatch tones out the individual fire departments after determining that a 911 call requires emergency response in that fire departments' area.

We provide and receive mutual aid with Linden and Carbon Fire Departments as needed. We provide medical first response to residents until an ambulance arrives and then assist Kneehill EMS as needed.
