2022 Property Taxes are due by **4:00 pm on July 28, 2022.** 





# **Transfer Site Frequently Asked Questions**

Q: When is the transfer site open?

A: Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm

Q: Can I recycle used engine oil?

A: Yes, containers must be completely emptied into oil reservoirs and the containers recycled separately.

Q. How do I recycle my cardboard boxes?

1. Remove all plastic / shrink wrap / styrofoam from boxes and dispose of in garbage;

2. Flatten all cardboard and boxes completely;

3. Place flattened cardboard in "Cardboard only" bins at the transfer site.

**PLEASE NOTE**: Do not put any plastic or styrofoam in the cardboard bins.

Do not put any cardboard in the newspaper bins.



#### **NEW SPEED SIGNS AND CROSSWALK SIGNS**

Please note, the speed limit signs coming into and leaving the Village from the North Entrance have been reduced to 30km/hr.



There is also a new crosswalk sign on Pacific Avenue to inform motorists that there is pedestrians crossing from the walking path to the Trans Canada Trail.



TRANSFER STATION

The Village of Acme Bylaw 2019-04: Traffic Bylaw states that the speed limit throughout the Village of Acme is 30 km/hr and 15 km/hr in alleyways. The change in these signs reflects the bylaw.

#### TRIMMING TREES AND HEDGES

Please keep all trees and hedges on your property trimmed back to prevent them from encroaching onto the sidewalk and alleyways.

Sidewalks must be clear of all branches and hedges to provide room for pedestrians to easily walk on the sidewalks. Please remember alleys and boulevards are the responsibility of the adjacent homeowners.



# CUTTING YOUR GRASS

When mowing, please do not blow it

on the road; the grass & debris clogs the storm drains.



#### FIRE BANS AND FIRE ADVISORY

For the 2022 season, the Village of Acme will be notifying residents of any fire advisories or fire bans through the Village of Acme website. If you would like to know if we are under a "Fire Advisory" or "Fire Ban" at any time, please refer to the Village of Acme's website: <a href="https://www.acme.ca">www.acme.ca</a>.



#### WHAT IS A FIRE ADVISORY?

A fire advisory means no open fires or fires requiring a burning permit. An advisory only allows for, recreational fires in covered fire pits, approved fire pits in campgrounds and parks, propane, natural gas, charcoal, and pellet barbeques, grills, or smokers. All other fires are not permitted until the advisory is lifted.

#### WHAT IS A FIRE BAN?

A fire ban means all fires of any type using any form of fuel are prohibited in the Village.

In previous years, the Village of Acme has followed Kneehill County's fire advisories, restrictions, and bans. This will no longer be the case. To stay updated on the Village of Acme's fire advisories, restrictions, and bans, please go to www.acme.ca.

# PREVENT SEWER CLOGS / BACKUPS

If you are experiencing a sewer backup, it's most likely due to a blockage in the sanitary sewer service line between the house and the Village's sewer main.

In order to prevent pipe and sewer blockages and to avoid costly clean-up bills, the only items that should be flushed down your toilet are human waste and toilet paper. Also, if you don't use a lot of water or are not always home, flush your toilets weekly / monthly with a 5-gallon pail of water to ensure there is adequate flow to flush out your sanitary sewer lines and clear any

debris. This can also prevent

freeze ups in the winter months.

# The following is a list of items that should NOT be flushed down the sewer system:

- Facial Tissue / Kleenex
- Baby Wipes
- "Flushable" Wipes
- Disinfectant Wipes
- Hand Wipes
- Toilet Bowl Scrub Pads
- Napkins (Paper / Cloth)
- Diapers
- Paper Towel
- Cotton Balls / Swabs
- Dental Floss / Strings
- Egg Shells / Nut Shells / Coffee Grounds
- Fats, Oils, and Grease (FOG)
- Hair

- Plastic of any kind
- Cigarette Butts
- Medicines or Pharmaceuticals, Medical Sharps
- Band Aids / Bandages
- Cat Litter
- Paints, Varnish, Paint Thinner, Automotive Fluid
- Poisons / Hazardous Waste
- Garden Wastes, Wood, Sawdust, or Shavings
- Food Scraps and Bones
- Sanitary Napkins, Tampons, Condoms



## 2022: THE YEAR AHEAD...

In 2022, the Village anticipates doing work on following Capital Projects:

- Water Meters: Finish replacing all water meters to remotely read meters in the properties throughout the Village to better serve our residents with utilities. IN PROGRESS
- **Sidewalks:** Replace some sidewalks throughout the Village.
- Paving:
  - ♦ Complete the final overlay paving on Davis Street, the cost of which was included in the original budget from 2021.
  - Paving Bennett Avenue from Allison Street to Nolan Street.
     COMPLETED
- Lift Station: The Village has applied for a grant for a new lift station. We have not received notice of the decision on our application. Should we be approved, we will move ahead with this project.
- Green Space: Construction of the Green Space owned by TrailNet South of the Village Office will begin. This will include a central feature, trees, shrubbery, and open grass space for residents to enjoy. This is a multi-year project. *IN PROGRESS*
- ◆ Land Use Bylaw (LUB): COMPLETED
- ◆ Area Structure Plan (ASP): COMPLETED
