Q: How do I recycle my cardboard boxes?


A: Remove any plastic, newspaper, Styrofoam, and/or packing peanuts; flatten boxes completely, deposit in the Cardboard bins at the Transfer Site.

ATTENTION MOBILE HOME OWNERS/RENTERS

To prevent water lines from freezing under your home this winter, please ensure your water lines are protected with heat tape, insulation, and skirting around your home. *Expect a COLD winter!*



GARBAGE BIN CLEANING

Some garbage bins throughout the Village have loose garbage in the bottom of the bin / can, maggot infestations, and / or mice. This can be a potential hazard for our Public Works employees when they gather up the garbage.

TRANSFER STATION

- Please clean out any loose garbage from inside your garbage bins.
- Please wash out your garbage bins to ensure they are clear of maggots, mice, and residue that can attract varmint.

GARBAGE REMINDERS

- Please ensure all garbage bags are tied closed so they do not spill out.
- Only 4 garbage bags will be picked up.
- Bags must be no more than 40 pounds.



KEEP THE STREETS CLEAR

After a snowfall, please have your vehicles moved off of the streets so Public Works can easily clear the snow.



Vehicle Theft and Property Break-in Prevention Tips from the RCMP

Vehicle theft and car prowling prevention tips:

- Report any suspicious activity or behaviour to the RCMP, such as someone trying door handles on parked vehicles.
- Garage openers should not be left in vehicles or should be disengaged, as thieves can use them to gain entry into a home.
- · Avoid parking in unlit areas at night.
- Lock your doors and close all windows at all times, even while you are in your yard.
- Hide your valuables out of sight, or better yet, take them with you.
- Don't keep extra keys in your vehicle.





THEFT PREVENTION

Home and garage break-in prevention tips:

- Report any suspicious vehicles, activity or behaviour to the RCMP, such as someone showing up at your home "mistakenly" looking for a different address, or going through yards of neighbours who you believe are away.
- Remind your family to close the garage door(s) after removing bikes, vehicles and other items.
 Any open door is an invitation.
- Despite the warm weather, it is important to ensure windows and doors are secured at all times, even when you're home. Culprits need mere moments to commit a theft.
- If you are away, ensure a friend or neighbour picks up your mail and flyers and keeps your yard appearing cared for, giving the impression that you're around.
- Use timers to control lighting within the home.
- Install exterior motion lights to brighten dark areas around doors or windows to make them easily seen by a neighbour or passersby.
- Lock all garage doors, including the one between an attached garage and the house.
- Always close and lock any windows that could be used to gain access to your home while you're away or sleeping, even on hot summer nights.
- Store important or irreplaceable documents and items away from your home, such as in a safety deposit box. If you see homes with open doors, front doors with keys left in the locks, or a neighbour's car with the trunk left open, give them a quick call to let them know.
- Consider installing home and vehicle alarm systems and vehicle anti-theft devices.

THE SILENT KILLER

RADON AWARENESS

November is radon awareness month in Canada. If you have not yet tested your home or if it has been more than 5 years since you last tested, it's time to test again. Globally radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer, second only to smoking. The World Health Organization estimates nearly 190,000 people a year die from radon induced lung cancer. Radon is a naturally occurring, colourless, odourless radioactive gas that can enter the home through small cracks in the foundation, where it can build up to high levels and present a significant lung cancer risk to the occupants of the home. 1 in 7 homes in the Calgary area have levels that exceed Health Canada's recommended action level of 200Bq/m³. Based on the World Health Organization's recommended action level of 100Bq/m³, an astoundingly high 1 in 2 homes in this area have levels exceeding the standard.

There is no "safe" level of exposure to radon - higher exposure presents higher risk, lower exposure lower risk, but radon gas exists everywhere at some level. High radon exposure is particularly concerning for those who smoke - the risk of lung cancer for a smoker exposed to consistently high radon exceeds 1-in-3

The good news is testing is easy and mitigation technology is well established. Simply get a health Canada approved test kit and hang in your home for 91 days during heating season beginning Oct 1. Three and seven day test kits are also available, however it is important to know that Health Canada recommends ONLY a long term (91+ day) test be used to determine your home's risk - this is because radon levels can fluctuate greatly on a day by day basis and tests performed for less than 91 days do not accurately reflect your overall health risk.


