Transfer Site Frequently Asked Questions

Q: When is the transfer site open?

A: Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm

Q: Where can I take appliances?

A: Appliances (stove, washer, dryer, fridge, freezer, microwave) can be taken to Linden Transfer Site.



METAL AND RUBBLE BINS ARE BACK FOR THE MONTH OF MAY!

REMINDER: These bins are for Village of Acme Resident use only.

Metal Bin

No appliances: Linden takes appliances at no charge.

Remove any fabrics / plastics off metal. Place metal in metal bin: plastics & fabrics go in the rubble bin.

Allowed - BBQs, bikes, hot water tanks, etc.

Rubble Bins

No appliances, construction material, lumber, plaster, drywall, concrete, or shingles.

No electronics: microwaves or televisions.

Allowed: Household clean up (example: mattresses, carpets, furniture, plastics)

RULES for TRANSFER SITE for METAL AND RUBBLE BINS

To reduce congestion, the transfer site is implementing the following rules:

- ◆ Please **KEEP TO THE RIGHT** and drive in a circle around to the Metal and Rubble bins.
- Please FOLLOW the attendant's directions.
- ◆ Please unload your items **SAFELY** and **QUICKLY**. There are others waiting to unload.
- Please be courteous and patient.

Friendly Reminders:

- Speed limit is 15 km/hr at the Transfer Site
- Children under 15 years old MUST stay in the vehicle
- Please check with attendant to gather your information and direct you where to put items.

PREVENT SEWER CLOGS / **BACKUPS**

If you are experiencing a sewer backup, it's most likely due to a blockage in the sanitary sewer service line between the house and the Village's sewer main.

In order to prevent pipe and sewer • Disinfectant Wipes blockages and to avoid costly clean-up bills, the only items that should be flushed down your toilet • Toilet Bowl Scrub Pads are human waste and toilet paper.

Also, if you don't use a lot of water or are not always home, flush your toilets weekly / monthly with a 5gallon pail of water to ensure there • Cotton Balls / Swabs is adequate flow to flush out your sanitary sewer lines and clear any debris. This can also prevent freeze ups in the winter months.

The following is a list of items that should NOT be flushed down the sewer system:

- Facial Tissue / Kleenex
- Baby Wipes
- "Flushable" Wipes
- Hand Wipes
- Napkins (Paper / Cloth)
- Diapers
- Paper Towel
- Dental Floss / Strings
- Egg Shells / Nut Shells / Coffee Grounds

- Fats, Oils, and Grease (FOG)
- Hair
- Plastic of any kind
- Cigarette Butts
- Medicines or Pharmaceuticals, **Medical Sharps**
- Band Aids / Bandages
- Cat Litter
- Paints, Varnish, Paint Thinner, Automotive Fluid
- Poisons / Hazardous Waste
- · Garden Wastes, Wood, Sawdust, or Shavings
- Food Scraps and Bones
- Sanitary Napkins, Tampons, Condoms

BLACK KNOT PROBLEM

The Village will be doing a controlled burn to eliminate any black knot that has been removed. This will be occurring mid-May. Please bring any black knot trimmings to the transfer site to burn.

How can you recognize Black Knot?


The most distinguishing symptom of Black Knot is the characteristic black, tar-like swellings that develop on branches of the infected plant.

Initially, a small, olive-green gall or swelling will develop at a succulent growing point or fruit spur (as a result of spores landing and infection taking place). This swelling will grow until it is mature after 2-3 years. The mature galls are hard, black, 10 to 15 cm (4 to 6 inches) and may be somewhat ruptured. Mature galls will produce and release a vast amount of spores during the bloom period, resulting in a rapid increase in infections. The fungus continues to grow internally and externally, with the branch eventually becoming girdled and dying.

What can be done to control Black Knot?

- Removal of sources of inoculum (prevents population build up):
 - Prune out all knot-bearing branches during late fall, winter or very early spring when plants are dormant and knots are easy to see.
 - Remove infected branches to at least 15-20 cm (6-8 inches) below knot. NOTE: It is preferable to prune an infected branch further back to an appropriate location, such as a healthy collar, rather than leave a stub.
 - As a precaution, cutting blades should be cleaned and disinfected after pruning, if possible, especially if cuts have been made through obviously infected material.
 - ♦ For knots on scaffold branches or trunks that can't be removed, cut away diseased tissue down to good wood and at least 1 cm (1/2 inch) beyond the edge of the knot.
 - ♦ Failure to remove branches beyond the internal growth will result in re-growth of the fungus.
 - DISEASED WOOD MUST BE DESTROYED IMMEDIATELY (burned, buried or removed from site). Diseased knots can produce and release spores for up to 4 months after removal. Proper composting can help to accelerate the breakdown of infected materials.
- Ensure plants are healthy and free from stress (not a guarantee from disease).
- Regular monitoring.
- Ensure adequate canopy ventilation through proper pruning.
- Trimming black knot in the spring is the most effective way to prevent it from spreading and reinfecting.

If children need help they will pay for families unable to afford the cost.





2022: THE YEAR AHEAD...

In 2022, the Village anticipates doing work on following Capital Projects:

- Water Meters: Finish replacing all water meters to remotely read meters in the properties throughout the Village to better serve our residents with utilities.
- **Sidewalks:** Replace some sidewalks throughout the Village,
- Paving:
 - Complete the final overlay paving on Davis Street, the cost of which was included in the original budget from 2021.
 - Paving Bennett Avenue from Allison Street to Nolan Street.
- **Lift Station:** The Village has applied for a grant for a new lift station. We have not received notice of the decision on our application. Should we be approved, we will move ahead with this project.
- Green Space: Construction of the Green Space owned by TrailNet South of the Village Office will begin. This will include a central feature, trees, shrubbery, and open grass space for residents to enjoy.
- Land Use Bylaw (LUB): Complete the new LUB that will add more clarity for residents looking at developing or renovating areas within their properties and the Village.
- Area Structure Plan (ASP): COMPLETED




