<u>ONLY</u> empty motor oil containers can be recycled. Please note, the Transfer Station <u>DOES NOT</u> accept any other plastic container recycling

Unacceptable containers include: antifreeze / coolant, brake fluid, laundry detergent, windshield fluid, etc.

METAL & RUBBLE BINS

Metal and Rubble Bins will be available at the Transfer Site for Village of Acme residents from Thursday, August 31 - Tuesday, September 19. Please remember that there is no scavenging or going through the metal or rubble bins. Please wait for the attendant to advise where

items should be placed before unloading.

METAL BINS

Allowed:

- BBQs,
- bikes,
- metal bed frames,
- hot water tanks, etc.

Not Allowed:

- Appliances (dishwasher, fridge, stove, washer, dryer, freezer, microwave, etc.)
- Construction Material (lumber, drywall, concrete, shingles, carpets, etc.)
- Electronics (tv, computer, speakers, etc.)

<u>Please Remove</u> any fabrics and / or plastics off metal. Place metal in the metal bin. Place plastics & fabrics in the rubble bin.

RUBBLE BINS

Allowed:

Household clean up

Examples:

- area rugs,
- · mattresses.
- furniture,
- plastics, etc.

Not Allowed:

- Appliances (dishwasher, fridge, stove, washer, dryer, freezer, microwave, etc.)
- Construction Material (lumber, drywall, concrete, shingles, carpets, etc.)
- Electronics (tv, computers, speakers, etc.)


GARBAGE BINS

 To prevent your garbage bags from being broken or ripped open by birds and squirrels, please have a bin to put your garbage in.




- Garbage bins can be made of wood, plastic, composite, or steel.
- Please ensure the garbage bin you build or purchase has a lid.

GARBAGE PICK UP REMINDERS

- · Garbage must be out on Wednesday by 8:00am

Residents can take garbage to the Transfer Site at no charge should they have more than the 4 allowed bags or if the bags weigh more than 40 pounds.

PETS IN THE VILLAGE

Please remember to properly care for your pets and adhere to the Animal Control Bylaw #2018-15 regarding pets in the Village.

Maximum of 4 pets total: No more than 3 of either breed (cat / dog).



No running at large: All animals must be controlled on a leash or within a fenced yard.







Clean up all animal poop off any public or private property not owned by you.

DEVELOPMENT PERMITS / BUILDING

Anyone planning indoor or outdoor building or renovations projects are encouraged to discuss them with the Village Office prior to starting.



Building and renovation projects must follow the

requirements of the Land Use Bylaw.

Projects may require a development permit through the Village of Acme and / or building permit through Palliser Regional Municipal Services (PRMS).

Failure to comply with these regulations may result in stoppage of work.

CALL BEFORE YOU DIG

If you plan on digging within your property, please ensure you contact Utility Safety Partners (Formerly Alberta One Call) to have your utilities marked out. This request includes water, power, gas, and phone/internet lines. Some utilities are buried only centimeters below the surface.

Some examples of projects to request utility locates for include, but are not limited to:

- Building / Replacing Fence Posts
- Building a Deck
- Planting a New Garden
- Landscaping
