Message from Public Works

Transfer Site Frequently Asked Questions

Q: When is the transfer site open?

A: Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday 9:00 am to 5:00 pm.

Q: What recycling is available?

A: Newsprint,* Flattened Cardboard*, Oil Containers (please remove lids), Used Motor Oil, Oil Filters. *Please Note: Plastics 1 & 2 are no longer accepted.*

*Cardboard with food particles (pizza boxes/donut boxes), envelopes, bills, wrapping paper, bond paper, and shredded paper cannot be recycled.

Q: What do I need to do to have my garbage picked up on Garbage Day?

A: Please have all garbage **BAGGED**. Please ensure your bags are all **TIED**. A maximum of **4 bags** will be picked up each week. Garbage bags must not exceed **40 pounds**. Please have all garbage **out by 8:00 am** on Wednesday. *Please Note: When leaving garbage outside, please ensure it will not freeze to the ground or be ripped open by varmints. Public Works is not responsible for cleaning up any of these garbage messes.*

ATTENTION: MOBILE HOME OWNERS/RENTERS

TRANSFER STATION

To prevent water lines from freezing under your home in the winter, please ensure your water lines are protected with heat tape, insulation, and proper skirting around your home.



2022 UTILITY RATE INCREASES

Council passed the 2022 Master Rates Bylaw at their January 10th Council meeting. There have been approved increases to the utility rates. Below are the reasons for the increases.

- Water Rate Increases (from \$4.55/m³ to \$4.66/m³): These increases are due to the increased rates from our water provider, Aqua 7, who has to reflect their increased rates they receive from Drumheller.
- Water Maintenance Increases (from \$15.00 to \$16.00): The cost of repairs for infrastructure continues to increase. These fees charged on our Utility Bills is to help offset the cost of these repairs to ensure we can continue to provide the level of service expected by our residents for their water and sanitary needs.
- Sewer Rate Increases (from \$16.00 to \$17.00): The cost of infrastructure repairs are continuing to increase. Due to these increases, Council approved an increase to the sewer rates which are used for any maintenance and repairs of the sanitary infrastructure.
- Garbage Rate Increases (from \$36.00 to \$37.00 for residential & from \$72.00 to \$74.00 for commercial): The cost for the Village to have Drumheller Waste maintain and manage the refuse from the Village's garbage disposal has increased, this has been reflected in the rates our residents pay for this service.



All the increases that have occurred for 2022's Utility Rates are a proactive way for the Village to prepare for the inevitable repairs and maintenance of the system all our residents rely on. These fees help us to have sufficient funds to immediately repair and replace infrastructure in the Utility System.



2021: A YEAR IN REVIEW...

In 2021, the Village completed the following Capital Projects:

- Water Meters: Continued replacing all water meters to remotely read meters in the properties throughout the Village to better serve our residents with utilities. (Ongoing)
- **Sidewalks:** Replaced a block of sidewalk on the South side of Fowler Street between Prospect Avenue and Clarke Street.
- **Road Work/Utility Replacement:** Completed the proposed project on Davis Street & North Prospect: Repair/upgrade sewer and water systems and storm drains.
 - This project was budgeted at \$1.6 million and came in about \$200,000 under budget. Included in the cost was the block North of Davis Street on Prospect Avenue.
- **Culverts:** Replaced the culvert under Hwy 806 by the West Village Entrance to provide better flow of storm water through the Village.
 - The full cost of this project was covered by Alberta Department of Transportation.
- **Road Repairs:** South end of Pacific Avenue up to the Transfer Station was fixed after the damage caused by the May 2020 flooding.
 - The cost of this project was covered by the Government of Alberta's Disaster Recovery Program.
- **New Municipal Office:** Purchased 615 Pacific Avenue which was fully renovated into a new municipal office providing a space in the East Side of the building for a new business to come into the Village.
 - This project came within \$5,000 of the originally proposed budget.
- **Playground Equipment:** Installed new playground equipment in the green space behind the pool and at Rose Park.
 - The cost of these playgrounds was paid for in part by government grant monies and generous donations from the community.
- Municipal Development Plan (MDP): Passed a new MDP Bylaw.
- **TrailNet Agreement:** We have signed an agreement with TrailNet (the owners of all the old grain elevator land and railway track) to create some walking paths and green space for the Village. We began plans for the green space.

2022: THE YEAR AHEAD...

In 2022, the Village anticipates doing work on following Capital Projects:

- Water Meters: Finish replacing all water meters to remotely read meters in the properties throughout the Village to better serve our residents with utilities.
- **Sidewalks:** Replace some sidewalks throughout the Village,
- Paving:
 - Complete the final overlay paving on Davis Street, the cost of which was included in the original budget from 2021.
 - Paving Bennett Avenue from Allison Street to Nolan Street.
- Lift Station: The Village has applied for a grant for a new lift station. We have not received notice of the decision on our application. Should we be approved, we will move ahead with this project.
- **Green Space:** Construction of the Green Space owned by TrailNet South of the Village Office will begin. This will include a central feature, trees, shrubbery, and open grass space for residents to enjoy.
- Land Use Bylaw (LUB): Complete the new LUB that will add more clarity for residents looking at developing or renovating areas within their properties and the Village.
- Area Structure Plan (ASP): Working on developing an ASP for the Area on the North side of the Village to prepare for future growth.



ACME COMMUNITY SERVICE GROUPS

There are many service groups in the Village of Acme who do many things for the community. Each month we want to take some time to recognize these groups, share some information about their involvement in community, how they can support you, and how you can become involved.

FEATURED SERVICE GROUP: ACME SENIORS ASSOCIATION

• When did the Acme Seniors Association begin?

The Acme Seniors Association became a Society under the Societies Act of Alberta in October 1982. The Seniors Association facility on Main Street was purchased in July of 1983. Prior to it becoming a registered Society, there was a 50+ Seniors Group that met in the Village.



• What does the Acme Seniors Association offer for Seniors?

The Acme Seniors Association provides its facilities for members to fellow-

ship and have weekly days scheduled for seniors to gather to play pool and cards. The facility is also used by external groups such as Seniors Outreach to provide space for meetings, foot clinics, etc. that members can access.

• What does the Acme Senior's Association do for the community?

As an Society, the Acme Seniors Association is eligible for an AGLC casino every three years. The funds received by these casinos are used to maintain and pay for the utilities for the Seniors Centre.

In addition to maintaining the facility, the Seniors Association establishes a three-year budget that distributes the casino funds to local groups such as:

- School Scholarships - Seniors Outreach - Acme Outdoor Swimming Pool - Acme Food Bank - Acme Community Centre - Acme Municipal Library Board - Village of Acme Recreation Development, which has installed new playground equipment for the children of Acme and surrounding area.

• How can people get involved / who do they contact to get involved?






