Transfer Site Frequently Asked Questions



Q. When is the transfer site open?

A. Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm

Q: Where can I take my old, used engine oil and oil containers?

A: Used engine oil can be dumped into the large oil tank provided at the transfer site. Used oil filters can go into the a barrel next to the tank. Empty oil containers go in the shed next to the tank.

METAL & RUBBLE BINS will be available at the Transfer Site from Saturday, May 1 to Saturday, May 29. *Please remember, use of these bins are for Acme Residents only.*

BLACK KNOT FUNGUS

Many trees (mainly mayday, fruit trees, and shrubs) in the Village are being infected with Black Knot. If you see this fungus the only way to get rid of it is to cut it out of the tree, disinfecting the saw blade after each cut. Black Knot is a fungus that sets in over winter, gets in knots and twigs, then the branch swells in the spring. The fungus is carried by wind, rain and wildlife. This fungus is devastating and spreads quickly. The village will be removing or pruning trees infected with this fungus on village property only. Please do your part to stop the spread of Black Knot, be proactive.

- Water Meters: Continue replacing all water meters to remotely read meters in the properties throughout the Village to better serve our residents with utilities. (Ongoing)
- Sidewalks: Some sidewalks will be repaired/replaced throughout the Village. (Summer)
- Road Work/Utility Replacement: Davis Street & North Prospect: Repair/upgrade sewer and water systems and storm drains. (Spring/Summer)
- Culverts: Hwy 806 North of Village Entrance (Alberta Department of Transportation) (Summer/Fall)
- Road Repairs: Pacific Avenue Transfer Station to Trail Net Crossing (DRP) (Summer/Fall)
- Road Repairs: Complete road work on Wheeler Avenue South. (Summer)
- Sewer Repairs: Along the pathway from Walsh Avenue towards Heritage Estates. (Summer/Fall)
- Municipal Office: Purchasing 615 Pacific Avenue, fully renovated into a new office. (May/June)

- Playground Equipment: Purchase and Install new Playground equipment (Spring/Summer)



What we're doing to keep you safe:

- Restricting access to the building.
- ♦ Limiting the access to 4 patrons in the library at one time.
- Maintaining 6 feet of distance between each other.
- Wearing face coverings.
- Following cleaning and disinfecting protocols.

What we're asking you to do:

- ♦ Ring doorbell to access the building. You will be allowed to enter the building if there are not more than 4 patrons currently (providing you pass the self screening questions posted on the entrance).
- ♦ Keep your hands clean. Hand sanitizer will be provided at entrance and throughout the library.
- Maintain at least 6 feet of distance from others.
- Wear face coverings. Mask are available on request.
- Adults must accompany and actively supervise children.
- ♦ Linger within the library only for the length of time needed to choose or pickup items.
- ♦ Only touch items you wish to borrow. Any unwanted items pulled off the shelf must be put into quarantine. Gloves or hand sanitizer must be used for browsing, gloves available if needed.






KRFCSS dropped off a few Craft Bags at the Village Office for residents to pick up. These craft bags include things such as: Origami Fortune Tellers,
